

<b>Covenant</b>	Is a sacred agreement between God and His people. God sets specific conditions and He promises to bless us as we obey these conditions.
<b>Resurrection</b>	Jesus rising from the dead
<b>Ascension</b>	When Jesus Christ went into heaven on the 40th day after His Resurrection
<b>Sanctifying Grace</b>	The new life we receive at Baptism
<b>Permanent Seal</b>	At Baptism the Holy Spirit marks us with the seal of the Lord and we become His adopted children.
<b>Chrism</b>	Perfumed oil blessed by the bishop during Holy Week, used for anointing.

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Eucharist</b></p>	<p>Greek word which means Thanksgiving. Term referred to for the sacrament when we receive the bread (body) and wine (blood) of Christ. At the Last Supper Jesus took bread and broke it and gave thanks.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Baptism</b></p>	<p>The first Sacrament of Initiation into the Church.          -We are baptized in water in the Name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; anointed with Chrism and receive the Holy Spirit.          -We become children of God free from original sin          -We are given new life          -We become members of God's family.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Last Supper</b></p>	<p>The meal held by Christ and His disciples on the eve of his Passion where He established the sacrament of Holy Communion</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Commandment</b></p>	<p>A divine law that God has revealed</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Original Sin</b></p>	<p>Sin inherited from Adam and Eve, who ate the forbidden fruit in garden of Eden and sinned against God.</p>
